President Rodney Strange read the following statement:

Tonight, we announce that at the end of this school year, Dr. Raymond Bryant, our Superintendent for the past four years, will be leaving us. Ray is going to pursue new opportunities in education as he reflects on a 38 year career in public education. Ray has provided the Board more than the required 60 days notice of his leaving in order that we may find a suitable replacement for him.

During the next few months, Ray will be using some personal and vacation time while Joe Hochreiter works with the Board on finalizing the budget and related matters.

When Ray first came to Elmira four years ago, two of our middle schools – Ernie Davis and Broadway – were on the State’s “needs improvement” list. We were also seeing a rise in spending and taxes. Now, four years later, both of these schools are listed as New York State Schools in Good Standing. In addition, just today, the District received word from the State Education Department that the District as a whole is in Good Standing status and off the needs improvement list. This comes at a time when the District is preparing its third budget in a row which calls for no increase in the tax levy, thanks in part to Ray’s leadership and fiscal management efforts.

The Board wishes Ray good luck in his future endeavors and appreciates the time and commitment he has provided Elmira during his time here.

Buildings & Grounds
Committee

Mr. Paul Bedford, from Keystone Associates, along with Willie Holleran, Supervisor of Buildings and Grounds reported on the re-bid at EFA. The total of all contracts for EFA, Administration Building & Thomas Natatorium and the re-bid of the general construction contract is less than the allocated budget for this project. There was also a discussion on the asbestos abatement

and asbestos caulk on the windows at EFA. Mr. Bedford also spoke about the track and field project at EFA, which will begin in April and completed by August 1st. He also reported that the interior and exterior work for EFA will begin as soon as exams are completed. There will be three major projects at EFA, they are the science rooms, ceiling and curtain walls.

Mr. Hurley talked about lighting the fields at EFA. He stated that the bid for EFA has come in low. We have the funds to light the fields and this would be a good time to do it while the fields are under construction. The cost would be around \$150,000. Mr. Strange is concerned with the promise they made to the neighbors with regards to disturbance of the lights near their homes. He wants the community to be aware that this is being considered and will put it on the April 1st agenda.

There was a brief discussion with regards to the SHS bids. Mr. Bedford stated that if the prices come in over budget, the district will need to do something different. If the prices come in reasonable, we can move forward.

Audit Committee

Mr. Strange informed the Board that the approval for the forensic auditors, Eldredge, Fox & Porretti, LLP is on the agenda this evening for approval. He also informed the Board that by the middle of May the Internal and External Auditors positions will be filled.

Community Relations Committee

Mr. McGovern reported that his committee is working on the transition between 5th and 6th graders. The Pre-K registration has gone very well and he thanked Chris Mecke for her help.

Dr. Lax reported that there are new policies and revised policies on the agenda for this evening to be approved. He also reported that the policy committee is having meetings with individuals with regard to the class rank policy and will report back to the Board after those meetings and further how to proceed.

**BUDGET
PRESENTATION**

Mr. Hochreiter spoke about the budget update and recommendations made by the administration. He also spoke about the \$118,234,504 budget, which represents no increase to the tax levy and the district being in good standing with the State

Education Dept. He went on to speak about the ELA scored at the elementary and middle Schools and the math ELA scores, middle school acceleration, high school supports, budget recommendations and frequently asked questions.

Mr. Gleason stated that the \$118,234,504 is driven more by revenue and said that the budget is built on the stimulus packet that comes through the State. He informed the Board that there is an increase in debt service, health insurance, contractual salaries; which amount to 1.7 million dollars.

Dr. Lax suggested that Attorney Wolan look into the teachers contract with regards to counselors working during the summer. The Board gave approval to Attorney Wolan to look into this issue.
