REVENUES

School Districts receive money from several sources. These sources are:

- STATE AID The budget is based on the State's 2017-18 budget. State aid for the 2017-18 budget year is expected to be \$4,650,168 more when compared to the 2016-17 budget.
- 2. <u>OTHER INCOME</u> Any income received by the School District other than State Aid, Fund Balance or Tax Levy is included under this heading. Examples of other income would be; BOCES revenue, interest earnings, payments in lieu of taxes, refunds of prior year's expenses, gifts, rentals, fees, tax penalties, Medicaid reimbursements, and athletic event gate receipts.
- RESERVES The District maintains Reserve Funds established in accordance with guidelines established by the Comptroller of the State of New York.
- 4. <u>FUND BALANCE</u> Funds which are budgeted but unexpended at the end of a budget year, and revenues which are realized in excess of those budgeted for the year, are available at the end of one fiscal year to be carried forward as fund balance.
- 5. <u>TAX LEVY</u> This is the amount to be raised through local property taxes. The Board of Education desires to keep any increase in the levy as low as possible. For the 2017-18 school year, there will be a <u>0.0 %</u> increase to the tax levy set by the Board of Education in September 2017 for the 2017-18 school year.



SUMMARY 2017-18 GENERAL FUND REVENUES

The two main sources of revenue are the local tax levy and aid from the State of New York. For a number of years, the State has provided about 72 percent of the total district revenues. This year the estimated amount of aid totals \$91,087,382. This means that the local taxpayer will be paying approximately 26 percent of the district expense, while the State's contribution is 72 percent. Other local projected revenues of \$3,113,104 will also be committed to fund the new budget. This other revenue and fund balance represents 2.0 percent of the budget.



Instructional Expenditures for General Education are K-12 expenditures for classroom instruction (excluding Special Education) plus a proration of building level administrative and instructional support expenditures. These expenditures include amounts for instruction of students with disabilities in a general-education setting. District expenditures, such as transportation, debt service and district-wide administration are not included.

The pupil count for General Education is K-12 average daily membership plus K-12 pupils for whom the district pays tuition to another school district. This number represents all pupils, including those classified as having disabilities and those not classified, excluding only students with disabilities placed out of district. Pupils resident in the district but attending a charter school are included. For districts in which a county jail is located, this number includes incarcerated youth to whom the district must provide an education program.

Instructional Expenditures for Special Education are K-12 expenditures for students with disabilities (including summer special education expenditures) plus a proration of building-level administrative and instructional support expenditures. District expenditures, such as transportation, debt service and district-wide administration are not included.

The pupil count for Special Education is a count of K-12 students with disabilities for the school year plus students for whom the district receives tuition from another district plus students for whom the district pays tuition to another district. Students attending the State schools at Rome and Batavia, private placements and out-of-state placements are included.

Instructional Expenditures Per Pupil is the simple arithmetic ratio of Instructional Expenditures to Pupils. The total cost of instruction for students with disabilities may include both general- and special-education expenditures. Special-education services provided in the general-education classroom may benefit students not classified as having disabilities.

TOTAL EXPENDITURES PER PUPIL




Total Expenditures Per Pupil is the simple arithmetic ratio of Total Expenditures to Pupils. Total Expenditures include district expenditures for classroom instruction, as well as expenditures for transportation, debt service, community service and district-wide administration that are not included in the Instructional Expenditure values for General Education and Special Education. As such, the sum of General Education and Special Education Instructional Expenditures does not equal the Total Expenditures.

INFORMATION ABOUT STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES (2015 - 16)

Commissioner's Regulations require reporting students with disabilities by the percent of time they are in general education classrooms and the classification rate of students with disabilities. These data are to be compared with percentages for similar districts and all public schools. The required percentages for this district are reported below.

The source data for the statistics in this table were reported through the Student Information Repository System (SIRS) and verified in Verification Report 5. The counts are numbers of students reported in the least restrictive environment categories for school-age programs (ages 6-21) on BEDS Day, which is the first Wednesday of the reporting year. The percentages represent the amount of time students with disabilities are in general-education classrooms, regardless of the amount and cost of special-education services they receive. Rounding of percentage values may cause them to sum to a number slightly different from 100%.


